General Tournament information

Age:

Minimum 18 years old

Divisions:

Men – Women - Veterans + 40 years

Open weight:

This tournament will be an open weight tournament, so no weight divisions.

We will start the list of competitors with the heaviest competitor at the top and go down till the lightest, from there we will start.

In the first round the competitors will be there for meet somebody of approximately their own weight.

Per round the weight differences will be more and more noticeable.

ICHIBAN trophies:

1st place – 2nd place – 3rd place

Best light weight – Best middle weight – Best heavy weight

Spirit price – fastest KO

Duration of a bout:

1st round,

3 minutes – 1 extensions of 2 minutes – weight difference (5 kg) - enchō-sen 2 minutes

2nd round,

3 minutes – 1 extensions of 2 minutes – weight difference (5 kg) - enchō-sen 2 minutes

3rd round (quarter finals)

3 minutes – 1 extensions of 2 minutes – weight difference (5 kg) - enchō-sen 2 minutes

4th round (semi finals)

3 minutes - 2 extensions of 2 minutes – weight difference (5 kg) - **Tameshiwari** men / women 3 techniques, seiken, shuto, empi/hiji (minimum 2 boards), **KO system** - enchō-sen 2 minutes

5th round (finals)

3 minutes - 2 extensions of 2 minutes - weight difference (5 kg) - **Tameshiwari** men / women 3 techniques, seiken, shuto, empi/hiji (minimum 2 boards), **KO system** – enchō-sen 2 minutes

Depending the number of competitors, the organisation will have the right to change the number of rounds. If needed a qualifying round can be added.

Obligatory regulations:

Due to constant changing European laws and to protect the participants, take note of the obligatory regulations and act accordingly.

If a participant or coach refuses to live by the obligatory regulations as written below, or by any regulation announced by the organization before or during the tournament the participant can be disqualified.

The organization has at all times the right to change the regulations if the organization thinks it is for the safety of the participants.

- **Groin and Teeth protector** (mouth guard) are **obligatory**
- The females are allowed bust protectors, bust plates are not allowed
- In the first round **no bandages** or **tape** are allowed, as of the second round only when authorized by a doctor or the organization
- Shin and instep protectors are not allowed
- Enrolled sleeves are not allowed
- Piercing, combs, clips, pins or any other protruding object of whatever material in or at the body, are not allowed and will be asked to remove.

Attention to personal hygiene is required (body and clothing). This will be checked at the beginning of the competitions. Please ensure nails of both fingers and toes are short and clean.

The coaches have to ensure that their participants and public act in a respectful and fair play manner.

Only 1 coach is allowed near the mat. The public is not allowed near the mat.

Tournament Rules

Referee and Judges:

There will be 6 (only Tezuka members) Referees
1 head referee (shushin),
1 arbitrator (shinpan)
4 corner judges (fukushin).

Referee dressing code:

Black or marine blue trousers
White shirt, short sleeves, with new official world wide Tezuka Badge with Country name.

Hantei- victory by decision

Only a decision supported by three out of the five referees is valid.

Victory is awarded to the competitor:

Who has scored one **IPPON** (full point)
Who has scored a **WAZA-ARI** (half point)
Whose opponent has obtained any **GENTEN**,
Whose opponent has been **DISQUALIFIED** by **HANSOKU MAKE** or **SHIKKAKU**.

Waza-ari – half point:

Any authorised technique which downs the opponent for three seconds or 3 counts, after which he stands in kumite dachi, is regarded as a half-point.
If the opponent has lost his will to fight or he stops the fight without permission, so for whatever reason, for three seconds or 3 counts, it will be regarded as a half-point, (the counting continues).
If the opponent has received so much damage that he loses his balance, but does not fall down, it will be regarded as a half-point.

Ippon – full point:

Any authorised technique which vigorously downs the opponent for more than 6 seconds or 6 counts, is regarded as a full-point.
If the opponent has lost his will to fight for more than 6 seconds or 6 counts, it will be regarded as a full-point.
Two half-points waza-ari, waza-ari awesete ippon, results in a full-point: IPPON

HANSOKU: Fouls

KINTEKI-GERI - groin kick

ZUTSUKI - head thrust

TSUKAMI - grabbing

KAKE – hooking, neck, head, shoulders etc

OSHI – pushing

KAKAEKOMI – clinching

KAKENIGE - running away

JOGAI - repeatedly stepping outside shiai-jo

All attacks with the hands or elbows to the opponent's face or neck.

Attack from the back

Attack an opponent who is already down.

Any action that may be considered as a bad attitude towards the contest

Any other actions that the referees may be regarded as foul.

PENALTIES

CHUI:

Unofficial warning

CHUI ICHI:

1st official warning

CHUI NI:

2nd official warning results in **GENTEN ICHI** (chui ni onagi genten ichi)

GENTEN ICHI:

first official penalty,

The fighter in question loses, only by being a much, much better fighter during that round and the beneficial fighter is avoiding the fight during that round, it must be a combination of these two items,

hikiwake can/may be considered.

CHUI SAN:

3rd official warning, the fighter in question needs an IPPON to win,
waza-ari + chui san = make (losing)

CHUI YON:

4th official warning results in **GENTEN NI** (chui yon onagi genten ni, hansoku make or shikkaku)

GENTEN NI:

2nd penalty results in **HANSOKU MAKE** or **SHIKKAKU**

HANSOKU MAKE:

Losing the bout because of foul play but is not disqualified for the tournament

SHIKKAKU:

disqualification for the tournament

TERMINOLOGY USED BY JUDGES

REI: bow,

SHIRO nakae: White competitor enters the shiai-jo

SHOMEN-NI-MUITE: face front

AKA nakae: Red competitor enters the shiai-jo

SHOMEN-NI-REI: bow to the front (public).

Migi mawate **RIJIN-NI-REI** face the officials table and bow, Migi mawate

SHUSHIN-NI-REI: Face to the shushin and bow.

KAMAITE: fighting stance

ZOKKO: Start again / continue

KINTEKI-GERI: groin kick

TSUKAMI: grabbing

OSHI: pushing

KAKENIGE: running away

OTAGAI-NI-REI: Face each other and bow.

HAJIME: Start the bout

YAME: Stop the bout immediately.

ZUTSUKI: head thrust

KAKE: hooking to the neck, head, shoulders

KAKAEKOMI: clinching

JOGAI: stepping outside shiai-jo with 2 feet

HANTEI-O-ONEGAI SHIMASU, HANTEI: asking for decision (politely, sensei)

HANTEI-O-TORIMASU, HANTEI: demanding a decision (ordering, shihan)

HIKIWAKE: undecided

KIKEN: withdrawal

GACHI: gain / winner

AKUSHU: shake hands

HANTEI: asking for a decision

MONDANAI: no score

FUSENSHŌ: not showing up (3 calls)

A doctor's decision is obligatory decision.

When a fighter is not allowed to continue the fight due to damage caused by his adversary, that adversary will be disqualified by the way of **hansoku make** or **shikkaku**.

TAMESHIWARI RULES

The materials used for the breaking test shall be boards of about 33 cm (13 inches) long, 21 cm (8 inches) wide, and 24 mm (0.9 inches) thick.

The referees shall check whether the materials correspond to the standards set up by the International Karate Organisation.

Each competitor shall use 3 techniques in the breaking test, these 3 techniques will be,

SEIKEN – fore fist **SHUTO** – knife hand **EMPI / HIJI** – elbow

Each competitor must break a minimum of 2 boards. However she/he may attempt to break as many boards as she/he likes.

The cloth on top of the boards shall have to be approved by the referee, and placed on the board by the referee.

The competitors are not allowed to move the blocks, however, they are allowed to measure the distant. The break is only approved of (KANZUI) if the boards are completely broken in two pieces. If they are only half broken it will be regarded as failure (SHIPPAI)

In case of SHIPPAI (failure) the competitor is allowed to try again, but the number will be limited to only 2 boards.

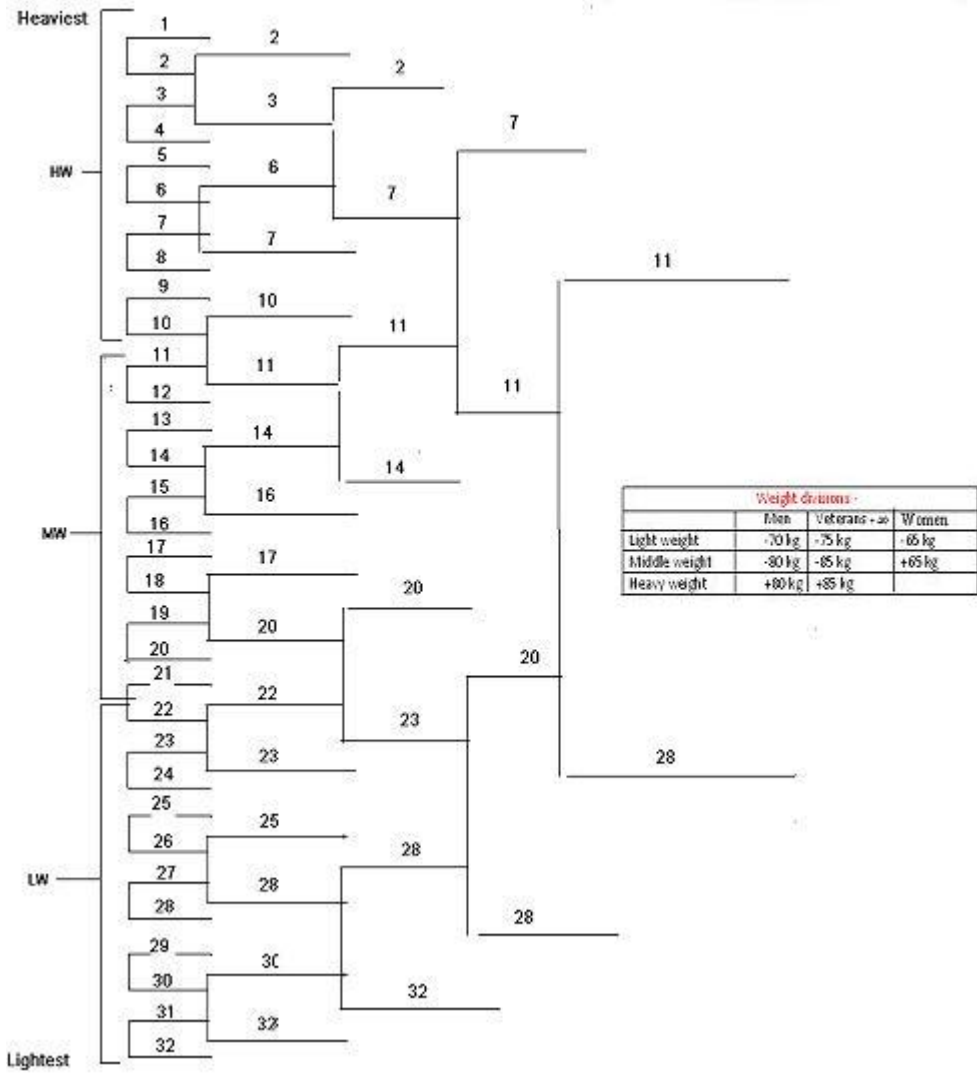
If the competitor fails the second attempt as well, the score of that attempt will be zero,

in case a competitor fails all 3 attempts she/he will be disqualified.

The TAMESHIWARI test will be held according to the referee's instructions. The time for breaking is set at two minutes. Overtime is considered as SHIPPAI.

After each break, the competitors shall move two steps counter-clockwise.
